Government Donation Scheme 2020 (aka School Donations Fee)

The Board of Trustees have opted to register to receive a \$150 per student, per year payment instead of seeking donations from parents.

To help guide our decision, Kaimahi prepared a budget to show use of this putea and it was agreed. The funds we receive will enable the kura to pay for the following:

- All stationery - **no more book lists** whānau
- All class trips
- All in kura performances and entry costs to other venues like the zoo.
- All online subscriptions
- Everyone will be entitled to a kura magazine.
- Poumua student camp fees will be paid.

Chromebooks:

The kura will use some of these funds to purchase chromebooks for use at kura. If whānau want their child to have the use of a chromebook at home then whānau will still need to purchase their own.

Whānau will still be responsible for:

- Costs for optional activities like Competition Kapahaka rōpū - Whitireia, Ngā Matarau
- After school and weekend sports groups
- Extra programmes like art splash.
- **Bus fees**

These programmes are not core curriculum and therefore costs will still apply.

Whānau who currently have automatic payments are requested to stop these at the end of the month.
