KURA PROGRAMMES: During the week our kaimahi have been reflecting on child and whānau engagement with the online programmes. And we have noticed that although the instructional time is less there is generally just as much work produced as when children attend kura, and the quality of the work produced is of a comparable standard.

As kaimahi we have learnt a lot about how we communicate - keep it short, simple and direct; provide lots of examples and, always be willing to revise how we use technology.

We think there is much to learn from this experience and we will spend time over the next few weeks thinking about how we provide the best learning opportunities for our tamariki face to face and online.
