Kei ngā whānau e noho taratahi tonu ana i tēnei wā tēnā koutou katoa. Kāore e kore kei te maharahara nei tātou kia rongo ka aha nei tātou hei te wiki e tū mai nei. Heoi me mihi ka tika tātou ki a tātou i tēnei wā, ahakoa he wā taumaha, ahakoa he taniwhā tūkinō kei tō tātou whenu taurikura, kua tata te wā pea ka tuwhera tika tō tātou kura. Heoi kia kaha manawanui tonu mai tātou, a kō ake nei ka puta ki te whai ao.

Tēnā koutou On Monday, 11 May the government will review whether we are ready to move to ALert Level 2. Until then we remain at Alert Level 3.

When the country does move to Alert Level 2 kura and schools will open for instruction, on the following Monday. Although we are still working out the details specific to our kura **please note that our kura programme will stop for a period of time while kaiako return to kura and prepare the site for our tamariki.**

- All schools are open on site for all year levels but distance learning for students not able to attend due to ongoing isolation.
- School transport will be available.
- Parents are asked to keep any sick children at home. If a sick child comes to school, they will be sent home.
- Children, young people and staff should be far enough away from each other so that they are not breathing on or touching each other.
- Good hygiene practices including regular cleaning of commonly touched surfaces will be maintained.

- Hand sanitiser or soap and water will be available in all classrooms. Soap, water and the ability to dry hands must be provided in bathrooms.
- Reminding everyone to regularly wash and dry hands, cough and sneeze into their elbow, and try to avoid touching their face.
- PE equipment can be used, playgrounds will be opened. However, again good hygiene protocols after PE will be emphasised.
- Contact tracing registers must be set up and identify which children and adults are on site, in each teaching space, including recording if there is a different composition of children and adults during the day. This includes recording visitors to the site, including parents.
- PPE is not required or recommended as necessary in any educational facility by the Public Health Service.
