### Hybrid Learning - Ako Mangarau Kura Tuatahi

All Pou have started some form of teaching online to include students who are isolating at home. All work will be loaded onto Seesaw for children to complete. Your child is not expected to complete work if they are sick. Timetables for online classes will be posted on Seesaw. If you have any concerns - please contact the tari.

**Devices-** For children in Poutokomanawa and Poutūārongo, we ask that a device in the home be provided for their use, where possible. We do not have enough devices to issue per child in these Pou. If you know your child will not be participating in online learning for whatever reason or you do not have internet access - please do not request a device. Last lockdown we had a few children who received devices however children were absent from most teaching sessions online but the device was seen active on other sites. If you have no internet access or have limited internet access - please contact the tari as we may be able to support you.

You can request hardcopies of work for your child through the tari if you wish.

We have been fortunate in being able to maintain a safe learning environment for our students and to remain open especially while there are kura closing all over the country. Let's not be complacent and focus on the small things - hand washing, mask wearing, limited numbers and monitoring our tamariki for any signs of illness. If your child is showing any signs of illness - please keep them home.
